Walking Trail

July 2022



1 Priory Gardens Riverside garden just off the High Street. Entrance via Figgins Lane or Jubilee Centre: formal gardens, trees and lots of picnic space, maintained by the Town Council

Walk along the High Street keeping left of the Town Hall. Tucked between Jacqueline Burns and Coffi Lab turn left into

2 Ironmonger Lane Walk past Juliet's charming courtyard garden. At the top of Ironmonger Lane turn left then take the first right onto Cross Lane. At the top turn right into

3 St John's Close An untended allotment in 2019 has been transformed into a wonderful Community Garden by the St John's Close Residents Association

Exit to The Common. Between the cemetery and rugby clubhouse to

4 Victorian Cemetery A closed cemetery planted with wildflowers by the Friends group to encourage wildlife

Head back towards town down Kingsbury Street. Turn left into Silverless Street then cross the road at The Green. Keep going downhill. On the left just before the roundabout you'll find the pedestrian gate to

5 Wye House Gardens Tranquil, formal garden with a spring fed pond, maintained by the Town Council

Walk through onto Kelham Gardens. Turn right and around the corner find a gate in the wall to

6 Plume of Feathers Garden Peaceful garden maintained by the Richmond Fellowship to promote wellbeing and positive mental health

Exit Plume of Feathers at the opposite entrance towards London Road. Turn right, cross at the zebra crossing, go into the Parade then turn left at the Fire Station into

7 Kennet Place Waterfront Garden: a grass verge transformed into a Community Garden and looked after by Val Compton, who's idea led to this walking trail!
